COURSE MANAGER REPORT November 2013

COURSE WORK

Greens

To help with drainage we verti drain the greens, this allows the water to move through the soil profile quicker allowing the greens to be open longer and after heavy rain recover sooner. If we didn't do this vital work monthly throughout winter the greens would be closed a lot longer.

We will verti drain the greens at the end of November.

The 7th green is lying wet through the centre. We are going to verti drain this soon with 1 inch tines and fill the holes with a porous volcanic material. This will help with the drainage but it is not a cure.

Approaches

We have verti drained these with 1 inch tines to a depth of 6 inches to relive compaction and help with drainage.

Tees

All of the tees have been over seeded in October and so far the 3rd and 5th tees have been dressed. We will continue with this program as the weather allows.

The tees are now in their winter positions. On the 4th the men's are still on grass, this may have to be rested when the weather turns really nasty.

Fairways

We have started the long slow process of verti draining the fairways. As some of you will have seen the tractor movers very slowly (0.6mph) so please be patient and wait for the tractor to get of your way before playing you shot. This is to relive compaction and help with drainage.

5th and 13th, the situation with the mats still remains the same. If the members don't put their divots back the mats will come back.

Rough

We have started to slit these areas when we can. We will carry this on over the winter period.

Boundaries

2 neighbours have requested work to be done or the trees taken down at the back of the 14th and 15th tees. I have told them that the trees are covered by a TPO order. I will apply to the council to carry out this work (they can say no) when we have an answer the committee will have to decide if the work is to proceed as we will have to pay for it to be carried out.

Temporary greens

These are always cut twice a week normally Monday and Friday.


Vandalism

On the 30th of October some little friends broke into the fuse box at the front gate (there is no live electrical circuits in this box) and placed sleepers across the driveway. The sleepers have been taken away from the area so this can't happen again.

Irrigation

The fence around the irrigation tank came off the night of the storm, I have asked 3 members for quotes to replace this but at this point only one has given a quote in. The tank is starting to corroded around the bottom because of leaf litter and around some bolts are showing the early signs.

OTHER ITEMS

The course damage after the storm was the fence around the irrigation tank and 3 trees blown over. The willow on the 2^{nd} , dead scots on the 4^{th} and dead scots on the 13^{th} .
