1771	APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MINUTES On a show of hands, the minutes of the meeting held on 19 May 2021, were unanimously accepted as a true record and the Chairman was authorised sign them.

1773	CHAIRMAN Nothing to report.	
1774	CAPTAIN	
(a)	The minutes of the Captains Committee meeting held on 2 June 2021 had been distributed and were tabled for discussion. Items for discussion: Rebate of £50 to members The Committee agreed that the rebate would be apportioned according to each membership category percentage, e.g., social members would get a £0.50p. A provision would be made in the 2020/21 accounts. It was also noted that the rebate would only apply to those individuals	
	who are members of the club on 31 July 2021. It was proposed that members be given the option of reinvesting their £50 rebate into course improvements.	
(b)	New Student Category A new Student category of membership at a cost of £300 pa was agreed. The new category would have full membership rights with the students being full time. Proof of student registration would be required.	
(c)	Courtesy Round of Golf Proposal that all playing members be given a courtesy round of golf in lieu of the periods during lockdown when members were not allowed to play. The club had some 513 playing members, their guests contributed a significant part of the club's green fee income.	

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	It was agreed that the green fee budgets could not be reduced to allow for courtesy green fees.

	Management accounts & report for the period to 31 May 2021, including a cash flow projection to 30 June 2021, had been circulated and was tabled for discussion.	
(a)	 Management Accounts: Subscription income more than expected Green Fee income less than forecast Buggy Surplus better than anticipated Bar & Catering operations better than anticipated Expenses less than budget (see text) Strong profit for the month 	
(b)	Cash Flow projection There was an improvement in the projected cashflow to the end of the year where we now expect a positive balance at year end. The agreed additional expenditures have been updated into the cashflow.	
(c)	Leased Broadband Line The current broadband line between the clubhouse and the junction BT box at the main gate is still a copper line and as a result the club only achieves an upload speed of some 10Mbit/s.	
	In discussion with out IT consultant the speed the club would need to run all its current devices which are now linked to the internet e.g., telephone system, membership & handicap system, till and mobile till system as well as members using the guest Wi-Fi, was around 100Mbit/s. The new irrigation system would also be linked to the internet, the club would therefore be future proofing its internet capabilities.	
	The Committee agreed that a leased line (fibre optic) from BT was the more suitable option.

Irrigation System

Plan A would be to commence the project in November 2021. Due to funding the earliest start date would be November 2022.

Three competitive quotes had been received and at the appropriate time each contractor will be interviewed to assess their availability and capability.

Two key suppliers Rainbird and Toro delivered presentations on their range of sprinklers and associated equipment, all controlled by an intelligent computerised management system.

Next action is an online meeting with Irritech to establish project status and formulate an outline plan to keep this project moving forward.
