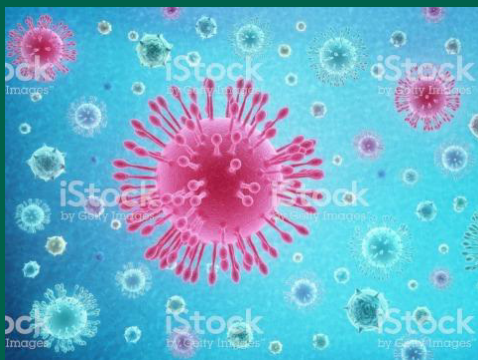

IMPORTANT COVID-19 ADVICE



Advice following a positive COVID-19 test from a player or staff member In most cases, there is generally no need to close down the facility. Control measures provided by regular cleaning and sanitation procedures should continue and prevent the need for closure.

- In the event of a member or visitor testing positive for COVID-19, the individual will be contacted by Test and Trace to identify close contacts. The club/ facility may then be contacted to provide details of others who were present at the same time
- The club/ facility does not need to take any steps unless contacted by Test and Trace in this way
- Anyone experiencing symptoms of COVID-19, even if mild, must self-isolate for 10 days from when symptoms started
- Anyone that tests positive for COVID-19 must self-isolate for 10 days from the date of their positive test
- Anyone living with someone experiencing symptoms or testing positive must self-isolate for 14 days
- Those who have been in close contact with someone that later tests positive for COVID-19 may be contacted by Test and Trace and instructed to self-isolate for a period of time
- If feeling unwell, please don't visit and follow self-isolation guidance above

USE OF BALL CHUTE

- All players in the 2/3/4-ball must be ready to play and at the ball chute when their ball is placed in the chute.
- Players are not obliged to stay around the chute. They may avail themselves of any facility at the club. However, if all the players are not there when their ball is next in line in the chute, the ball will be placed at the back of the ball queue by the marshal. If not being marshaled the ball may be moved to the back of the queue by players who already have a ball in the chute.
- No other interference of balls in the chute will be permitted



except with the approval of groups who already have balls in the chute.

- If a player wishes to join a group who already have a ball in the chute, that player should show courtesy to the groups behind that ball by seeking their approval to join the group in question. Such approval is not required from players not at the chute at that time.
- 4-balls are to be encouraged wherever possible, particularly at weekends.
- Any member refusing to take guidance and instruction from the marshal will be reported to the Captain's Committee and appropriate action will be taken.
- Weekend rules also apply on all Bank Holidays.
- No members or visitors are allowed to join other groups who have already started.
